
Welcome to Yestival '98 The 5th Official North American Yes Fan Convention

VENDORS: The vendor tables will be open throughout the whole convention, make sure you look to see what each table has to offer.


AUCTION: We plan to auction off several rare, collectable Yes goodies. Make sure to get your bid in!

Alan Parsons

Alan Parsons started his career as an assistant recording engineer at EMI Studios, Abbey Road. Certainly it would be hard to imagine a better way to pay your dues than working with Sir George Martin on The Beatles Abbey Road as well as on Let It Be. The list of credits grew quickly. Alan brought his audio engineering expertise to The Hollies hits, "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother" and "The Air That I Breathe", as well as sessions for The Shadows, Roy Wood, George Harrison (All Things Must Pass) and Paul McCartney (Red Rose Speedway). In addition, Alan earned a Grammy nomination for engineering on Pink Floyd's Dark Side Of The Moon album.

In the late '70s he formed The Alan Parsons Project who had many hit singles such as "Games People Play", "Time", "Eye In The Sky", "Prime Time", and others. During this time he continued to produce albums, notably the movie soundtrack for Ladyhawke. In 1993 Alan produced the orchestral sessions for The Symphonic Music Of Yes (RCA)

Victor) with the London Philharmonic Orchestra.

In the mid '90s Parsons returned to the touring circuit with Kansas as the opening act.

Parsons' new album, On Air, thematically traces the history of mankind's great will to fly from the Montgolfier Brothers' balloons right up to modern aviation and, as we enter the new millenium, the exploration of space, the stars, and the galaxies.

The album art is once again under the direction of Storm Thorgerson, well known for his artwork for Pink Floyd, Led Zeppelin, and, of course, Alan Parson albums.

On Air includes a CD-ROM which is a stunning sequel and partner for the audio CD. The On Air CD-COM delivers technical sophistication, exclusive graphics, a wealth of specialist information, and interactive originality.

This year Alan joins Yes on a 40 date tour of North America. Joining Alan will be Ian Bairnson on guitars, Stuart Elliott on drums, John Giblin on bass, John Beck on keyboards, and Neil Lockwood on vocals.



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
























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
